

promise to secure the innovative programs that transform our students' lives and allow for them to practice leadership in new ways."

Douglass' newest alumnae, members of the class of 2013, have benefited from the Campaign's success thus far. For example, funding assisted the students in the Africana House to experience service learning in South

Africa in January 2011. That trip impacted recent graduate Chinwe Oriji '13 to the extent that she then returned to South Africa for a semester and founded a "pen pal" project between U.S. and South African prison inmates. "This is what Douglass did for me. Douglass



stirred the fire to serve. They changed a local girl like me into a global woman leader of service."
